The Alliance's School Improvement Program

Target Cohorts

Student Champions

The Alliance supports the school to engage a cross-section of 10-15 students including:

- Priority cohorts (including students) at-risk of disengagement)
- Student leaders

The program is designed and delivered to support engagement of students with complex backgrounds.

Staff Champions

The Alliance supports the school to engage a cross-section of 5-10 staff including:

- School Leadership
- Wellbeing & Inclusion Staff
 Teachers (including early career
 teachers) passionate about education equity

A **Lead Staff Member** is required.

Objectives

To improve student engagement through meaningful voice and agency

To improve staff wellbeing and collective efficacy through meaningful voice and

agency

To enhance existing **school** improvement processes through codesign and systemthinking

To support effective (and coherent) implementation of **wellbeing** priorities and policy

The Core Program

- **Introductory Sessions** with both the Student and Staff Champions to 1 establish a collective understanding of education equity, including the specific barriers and opportunities to equity for the school community
- **Establishing shared norms** and practices for student-teacher 2 partnership
- Co-Design Workshops where Student and Staff Champions are 3 supported to work together to design interventions that address the barriers and opportunities to equity.
 - This includes **designing implementation** of existing school improvement and student wellbeing priorities, policies and práctices.

Inputs & **Outputs for** Program **Activities**

<u>Inputs</u>

A **lead staff member** is required to:

- Organise and coordinate the engagement of Student and Staff Champions
- Participate in all activities
- Liaise with the Alliance on the design of all
- · Liaise with School Leadership to align to their existing school improvement in

Outputs

From the Core Program Activities, schools will receive:

- · A report outlining key barriers and opportunities for equity
- A set of school norms for student/teacher partnership and codesign
- School improvement materials (including documented actions, evidence of impact and activities)

Cost - the Alliance's Facilitation Fee will be negotiated based on the school's circumstances, needs, and the extent of the program offerings required.

The Core Program - Timeline

Intake Meeting

Time: 1 hour Who: Lead Staff Member

- Program overview
- Model for student and teacher agency
- Identifying Student and Staff Champions

Student Champions Intro Session

Time: 2 hour session (or 2 x 1 hours)

Who: Student Champions, Lead Staff Member

- Build understanding of meaning of education equity (incl definitions, case studies)
- Explore their experiences of equity and those of their peers
- Establish a set of key barriers and key opportunities to equity

Staff Champions Intro Session

Time: 1.5 hour session

Who: Staff Champions, Lead Staff Member

- Education equity definition, data and research Explore and reflect upon student experiences including key barriers and opportunities

Co-Design Workshop

Time: 3 hour session

Who: Student and Staff Champions, Lead Staff Member

The Student and Staff Champions engage together to:

- Develop a shared understanding of existing wellbeing school improvement priorities
- Share and review the barriers identified in the Intro Workshops
- Utilise system-thinking tools to identify key challenges to implementation of existing school improvement priorities
- Co-Design school improvement actions
- Co-Design indicators of success

Additional Program Supports

Implementation & Monitoring Support

The Student and Staff Champions are supported to monitor implementation through Learning Walks and structured de-briefs aligned to the school improvement inquiry cycle.

Whole Staff and School Leadership Team Engagement

The Student and Staff Champions are supported to:

1) share learnings with whole staff/school leadership (e.g. staff PL)

2) gather whole staff and school leadership team input

Wellbeing & Inclusion Framework Co-Design

Student and Staff Champions are supported to lead the co-design of a Wellbeing & Inclusion Framework based around multi-tiered systems of support, including:

Identification of appropriate Tier 1-3 supports

Design of classroom 'indicators of success' for Tier 1 (Universal) supports

Design of an implementation plan

Alignment of supports through engagement of other key stakeholders (e.g. community supports, Department supports) in the co-design

Student & Teacher Feedback
